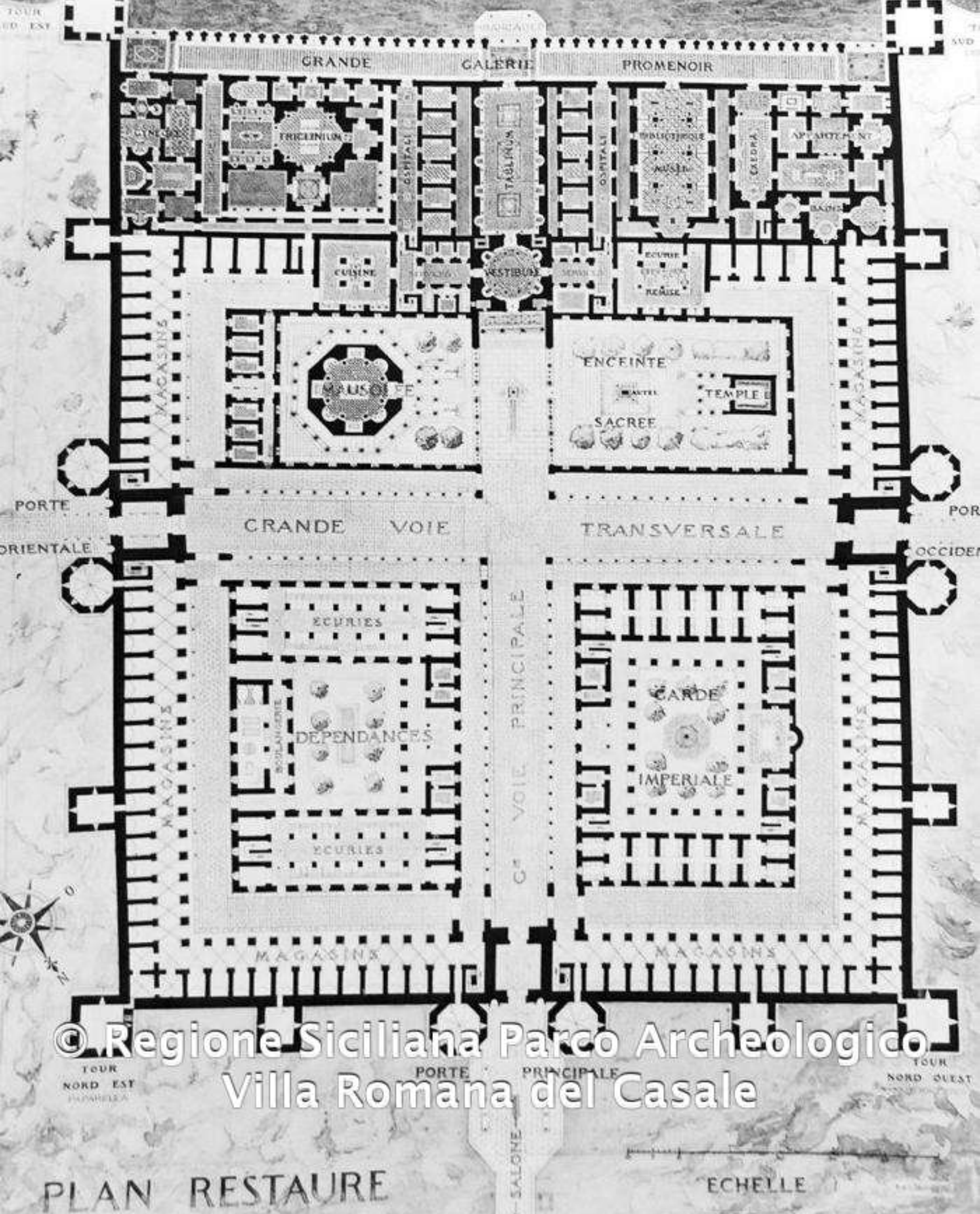


3. Palace of Diocletian at Spalato. (Plan.)

## THE GROUND-PLAN OF THE DIOCLETIAN'S PALACE

The ancient remains on the ground-floor are blackened; the more recent buildings are dotted.

- 1 The northern wall with the main entrance, so-called the Golden-gates
- 2 The eastern wall with the gates, so-called the Silver-gates
- 3 The western wall with the gates, so-called the Iron-gates
- 4 The southern wall with the small gates towards the sea
- 5 The crossroad of the main streets
- 6 The remains of the main longitudinal street (Cordo)
- 7 The remains of the main transversal street (Decurmanus)
- 8 The arches at the eastern street
- 9 The remains of the big north-east building
- 10 The remains of the big north-west building
- 11 The rectangular areas at the outer wall (of the warehouse)
- 12 Peristil
- 13 Diocletian's Mausoleum (from the Middle Ages, the cathedral)
- 14 Jupiter's Temple (from the Middle Ages, the baptistery)
- 15 and 16 The small round temples
- 17 The remains of the bath-house (thermae)
- 18 The remains of the building with the preserved mosaic
- 19 Vestibul, the entrance hall of the Diocletian's residence (i.e. the substructure at the lower floor)
- 20 The central hall, substructure
- 21 The passage by the forepart (portikat)
- 22 The area at the western part of the Emperor's residence (or the substructure at the lower floor)
- 23 The area at the eastern part of the Emperor's residence (or the substructure at the lower floor)
